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#### **Create Your Own Comic Book**

**Date and time:** Tuesdays 10/9 – 1/10. 2pm – 4pm

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

**Course description:** In this course, you will learn how to create a short, colourful, fun, comic book based on your own life experiences. These sessions will include a brief history of Comic Books, use of narrative in art, tutor guidance on drawing technique, use of colour, exchange of ideas and group discussion. Please feel free to bring any photos, images, books, etc. for inspiration.

## Understanding the Influences on Your Mind

**Course description:** The programme offers the opportunity to develop individual introspection and knowledge of how you see and respond to situations. This is through an introduction to MST System Thinking.

MST System Thinking not only helps improve the understanding of mind and mental health but it is also a collaboration tool that we use in organisations and with leaders to understand the underlying structure in which people operate.

**Teaching and Learning Approaches:** Workshop session focussing on education and awareness, rather than therapy.



#### Watercolour

**Date and time:** Mondays 16/9 – 21/10. 5.45pm – 7.15pm

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

**Course description:** Informal watercolour painting classes, with input from tutor Robert Turner, on various techniques - but with the emphasis on you creating art that you are happy with, and in your own style.

It is also hoped to look at the history of watercolour painting, and more closely at certain artists - and some of the science/physics underlying colour mixing.

The last session will feature a guest artist, who will give an introduction to her layered approach.



# Synagogue Visit

Location: Plymouth Orthodox Synagogue

**Course description:** Jerry will be giving us a tour and overview of Plymouth's Orthodox Synagogue, exploring the shared history and evolution of Plymouth, its Jewish population, Catherine Street and the Synagogue. Some comparisons and explanation of Judaic and Christian signs and symbolism will be included.

This is the same tour as was run in the Spring, but different from the Summer term.

**Teaching and Learning Approaches:** As well as being educational, there will workshop elements and interactivity where you will be able to participate and contribute.



## String Art

# **Black History of Plymouth**

**Course description:** The Hidden Figures of Plymouth Project, sponsored by The National Lottery Heritage Fund aims "to raise awareness, to celebrate and to create a memorable legacy for those people of colour who have made an outstanding contribution to the city of Plymouth."

In this course you will be introduced to some historical figures whom you may not be familiar with, and Living Figures who include authors, academics, poets, designers and business-people.

#### **Queer History**

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

**Course description:** The Rainbow Connection builds on the work of the Pride in Plymouth LGBT+ Community Archive in collecting and exploring the heritage of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities in the city of Plymouth, while acknowledging that the heritage is not handed down through generational lines in the same manner as other identity characteristics, so a younger generation does not automatically learn details of their LGBT+ heritage without direct intervention.

This project seeks to challenge this with the development of an inter-generational educational framework and resources that can encourage empowerment and the building of identity among LGBT+ groups of varying ages.

Through the collection of over 100 oral histories, Dr. Alan Butler will share with you a picture of queer life in the city and explain its importance.



# Still Life Drawing

## **Spoon Carving**

**Course description:** The course will be a series of sessions, each building on the previous one.

Session 1: Introduction to safely using an axe to produce a billet ready for carving a spoon.

Session 2: Introduction to safely using a knife to carve a spoon from a pre-prepared billet.

Session 3: Finishing and oiling your spoon.

At the end of the last session, you will hopefully have a spoon you can take home and enjoy.

# A History of Witchcraft and Witchcraft Trials

## **Talking Games**

You may or may not actually learn much (except how to play such games!), but you will hopefully have a relaxing and amusing time.

## Neurographic Art

#### **Oral History**

**Course description:** In some ways, oral history is the oldest form of history. People have shared stories around campfires since the world began.

However, since the advent of recording equipment in the last century, historians now have the opportunity to capture stories, transcribe them and make them part of the archive.

Oral History provides a means for previously unheard stories to be made part of history through people talking to one another. It can empower people and help them realise how important their story might be to future generations.

Join Dr Alan Butler for a workshop exploring the impact of this exciting process and how you might share yours and help capture someone else's story.



#### Esperanto
