#### Papermaking

#### **Pallet Planters**

**Course description:** During these sessions we will take old pallets, sand them down, cut them up and assemble the pieces together into a beautiful garden planter. Afterwards you can either keep the planter or donate it to Shekinah for their new garden space.

We will provide all the tools you need and explain in easy steps what you need to do.

#### **Sensory Theatre**

Participants would also learn how to create their own piece of sensory theatre. The workshops themselves aim to make participants feel at ease and encourage them to use their senses to tap into their imagination.



### **Emotional Logic**

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

**Course description:** These two introductory workshops will help you to look beyond behaviour to emotions and beyond those to the threatened values that are driving them. Then one small value can be recovered, resulting in a 'butterfly effect' or cascade of recovery. Learning to activate your own, innate Emotional Logic not only builds your inner strength, it enables you to have creative conversations to help others too.

**Teaching and Learning Approaches:** Talk and demonstration with practical interactive workshop.

**Assessment:** Optional, anonymous, before and after resilience questionnaires. Feedback on the course would also be very welcome.



#### Macramé

**Course description:** Macramé -noun- the art of knotting string in patterns to make decorative articles.

Believed to come from an Arabic word meaning "knotting crossways" or "an ornamental fringe."

Yvonne will introduce you to the basic knots and how to build on this to create decorative 3 dimensional objects. Make a gift for a loved one or for yourself. Suitable for complete beginners or to get back into a forgotten hobby.



# Threads - Gently Untangle Your Complex Life

# 7 Ways to Think Differently

**Course description:** Working through the book "7 Ways to Think Differently" by Looby Macnamara, participants will read two short chapters before each session and the group will explore each chapter together through the lens of Permaculture.

The chapters are: Abundance Thinking; Solutions Thinking; Systems Thinking; Thinking Like Nature; Co-operative Thinking; Thinking For The Future; From Thinking To Doing.

**Teaching and Learning Approaches:** Preparatory reading in own time and group discussion



#### Meditation

# History of Witchcraft

**Course description:** These sessions will focus on the festivals of Imbolc and Ostara.

Last term we discussed the witchcraft trials and we may revisit them.

Sarah will give an overview of what is known about this period in time, when religion and gender were central issues to brutal power plays.

We will discuss what it means to be a witch and how to be a self-proclaimed witch today.



# Cornish

**Date and time:** Mondays 3/2 – 10/3. 5pm – 7pm

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

**Course description:** A taster course covering the history and current situation of the Cornish language, its relationship to Welsh and Breton, some Cornish place names and basic conversational Cornish.



#### Watercolour

**Date and time:** Tuesdays 4/2 – 11/3. 5.45pm – 7.15pm

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

**Course description:** Informal watercolour painting classes, with input from tutor Robert Turner, on various techniques - but with the emphasis on you creating art that you are happy with, and in your own style.

There will be an emphasis on practical work, and there should be time to compare traditional approaches to more modern ones, especially regarding colour mixing and the use of gouache.

It is hoped that there will be a guest artist for the last session.



#### **Spoon Carving**

**Date and time:** Wednesdays 5/2 – 19/2. 2pm – 4pm **or** Wednesdays 5/3 – 19/3. 2pm – 4pm

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

**Course description:** The course will be a series of sessions, each building on the previous one.

Session 1: Introduction to safely using an axe to produce a billet ready for carving a spoon.

Session 2: Introduction to safely using a knife to carve a spoon from a pre-prepared billet.

Session 3: Finishing and oiling your spoon.

At the end of the last session, you will hopefully have a spoon you can take home and enjoy.

**Teaching and Learning Approaches:** Practical demonstrations and hands-on experience.



#### Hatha Yoga

It will focus on posture work, some breathing practices and meditation, in order to make each participant more aware of their body and enable them to feel more comfortable in it.

Please bring a small blanket, if you can, as a support or for keeping warm during savasana (rest).

First, you will blow out an egg, that you will design to your taste. Techniques include plain dying, natural dying and silk printing. The finished eggs will be threaded up to hang from a branch representing your Easter tree.

# Music and Wellbeing
