Paper Mâché

Course description: Making a solid shape out of wet, weak and floppy materials - How is this possible? Mary will introduce you to a versatile method of fabricating 3D models.

In the first session, you will sculpt paper mâché to a pre-made mould and then leave it to dry.

In the second session you have the opportunity to decorate your art piece, and might start on a new project - if time allows.

Hatha Yoga

At the end of each session, we will eat together, and take notes of what we have learned, to enable you to try at home.

All meals will be vegan with a vegetarian option.

Orthodox Christian Church Visit

Course description: Fr. Gregory will explain the distinctive differences between western (Catholic and Protestant) Christians and eastern (Orthodox) Christians, with reference to the distinctive layout of his church building.

He will cover theology, history and icons. After his initial presentation there will be time to ask questions.

The Orthodox Church is second in size to the Roman Catholic Church, comprising Greeks, Cypriots, Russians, Serbs, Romanians, Bulgarians, Georgians and Arabs, together with growing numbers in English-speaking countries.

This will encompass: Enhancing Life force energy and Awareness of the Human Energy Field chakras, Food and Nutrition for optimum health, Qi Gong, Mindful Meditation and Laughter Yoga.



Basic Bike Maintenance

Date and time: Tuesday 3/6 – 24/6. 4pm – 5.30pm

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

Course description: In the first two bike maintenance sessions you will learn how to degrease the drive chain; repair a puncture, know what tire pressure you should have and ensure that your gears and brakes are working (well!). Cleaning materials will be provided, but you will need to provide your own bike.

In the remaining two sessions you will be taken out onto local roads to gain confidence and learn where you should – and shouldn't be: in traffic, for example; what to do at junctions and where to put yourself/your bike to maintain a safe riding position.

You must wear a cycle helmet for the road sessions.



Wild Weaving

Course description: In this session we will make a beautiful basket out of natural materials that can be found anywhere - we will be using brambles and ivy. These skills are a great introduction into weaving.

Emotional Logic

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

Course description: These two introductory workshops will help you to look beyond behaviour to emotions and beyond those to the threatened values that are driving them. Then one small value can be recovered, resulting in a 'butterfly effect' or cascade of recovery. Learning to activate your own, innate Emotional Logic not only builds your inner strength, it enables you to have creative conversations to help others too.

Teaching and Learning Approaches: Talk and demonstration with practical interactive workshop.

Assessment: Optional, anonymous, before and after resilience questionnaires. Feedback on the course would also be very welcome.



Audio Tour of Jewish Cemetery

We will explore these perceptions in a fun way. Each session will have a warmup exercise, a main theme and then group discussion. It's your choice to share or not. And you don't have to be a talented artist, just an open mind.



Papermaking

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

Course description: Each session is stand-alone and will cover collecting & shredding paper, soaking & making pulp, then forming sheets which will then be left to dry.

Participants will then be free to collect the paper a couple of days later.



Bushcraft

Date and time: Monday 23/6 – 7/7. 11am – 3pm

Location: Shekinah, Stonehouse Creek

Course description: Session 1 (Fire): We will learn or refresh our knowledge on basic requirements you should have with you when you plan an outdoor excursion. This session will focus on making fire. We will cook and eat some simple nourishing snacks.

Session 2 (Shelter): In this session, we will learn about weather and appropriate clothing, and how to seek out or build shelters.

Session 3 (Water): Finally, we will experiment with gathering drinking water. After this last session we might set out into nearby areas and see if we can manifest the skills we have learned.

Please wear weather appropriate clothing. Parts of the session might be held inside, but we will be outside for most of it, no matter what the weather is like.



Talking Games

Course description: This session consists of simple, non-competitive, make-it-up-together-as-we-go-along games, and it involves making lists, stringing together sentences and engaging in brief conversations.

These exercises mimic real life small talk by embracing the playful side of it.

You may or may not actually learn much (except how to play such games!), but you will hopefully have a relaxing and amusing time.

Emmeline will show us various techniques, tools, and tips needed to embark on your ceramic bowl-making adventure. We will be forming and decorating the clay and paint the finished piece with coloured slips.

Conscientious Objection

Course description: Simon Dell is a researcher and author on social history; his book "The Dartmoor Conchies" was published almost 10 years ago. He volunteered as a chaplain at Dartmoor Prison for some years until closure.

Simon's presentation will look at the National issue of Conscientious Objector in the First World War and will be bringing it up to date. He will look in particular at the Dartmoor Work Centre (HMP Dartmoor) and how men were treated there.
